Pennebaker, best known for their film *Don't Look Back*, with Bob Dylan, and *The War Room*, which followed Bill Clinton on his first presidential campaign. *Unlocking the Cage* is similar to their other films, in that it follows an exceptionally talented and passionate person" who has dedicated his life to a "particular pursuit."

As Chris Hegedus writes in her Director's Statement:


